Together, Mississippi and Alabama comprise only about six percent of the U.S. Gulf Coast, with less than 100 miles of shoreline between the two states. However, this small area is anything but uniform — any local angler would agree that these nutrient-rich waters support a great diversity of life. In 2021, effort from Mississippi and Alabama anglers accounted for more than 25% of the total recreational fishery landings (by weight) in the Gulf. Whether they fish from shore, pier, or boat, there is something for every angler here.

Local fishing clubs and online groups provide valuable opportunities for anglers to connect with others who share their passion, learn new techniques, and participate in fishing trips and tournaments. There are plenty of ways to get involved whether you are a beginner or an avid fisherman. Free Fishing Days

Free fishing days allow anglers to fish without a license. The specific days vary by state and are a great way for beginners to try out fishing!

Mississippi:

On June 5th and 6th, 2023, during National Fishing and Boating Week, a sport fishing license is not required for Mississippi residents for all public waters. Mississippi residents can also fish without a fishing license on July 4th in all waters of the state. State Fishing Lake and State Park permits are still required.

Alabama:

A fishing license is not required to fish recreationally in Alabama's public waters on June 12th, 2023. State Fishing Lake permits are still required.

Free Fishing Day takes place during Alabama's red snapper season. While fishing license requirements are waived, those fishing for red snapper will need a \$10 Gulf Reef Fish Endorsement and a free saltwater angler registration. For more information, click <u>here</u>.
