Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art & Photography Contests

The Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art and Photography Contest is one opportunity to show off your talent or skill! The Art categories are Pastels/Charcoal/Graphite/Colored Pencil (Abstract or Realistic), Oil/Acrylic/ Watercolor (Abstract or Realistic), Pen/Ink/Markers/Crayon (Abstract or Realistic), Cartoon, Sculpture/3-D and Mixed, Altered Media. Photography categories are Action, Non-Action and Human Interest (Digital only). Photographs must be 5"x7" format in sleeve. Age divisions are 8-13 years old and 14-18 years old (as of January 1, 2024). Entries are due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **Friday**, **April 19, 2024**. The top 5 entries in each category will go on to be judged at the Region level, top 5 there go on to State level, and the top 5 in the state will go on to be displayed at the MS Wildlife Expo in Jackson in late July/early August. Solar Eclipse

A solar eclipse happens when the sun, Earth and moon are in a line and the moon covers the sun. On April 8, parts of the United States will experience a total solar eclipse. We will only experience about an 80% solar eclipse. You may ask how the moon can cover the sun when it is so much smaller (about 400 times smaller). The answer is that things that are farther away look smaller, and things that are closer look bigger. During the solar eclipse the moon will be about 400 times closer to the Earth than the sun, so it will look a lot bigger than it usually does and will cover the sun.

It is important to protect your eyes when watching a solar eclipse. Here are some tips on how to use solar eclipse viewing glasses safely:

- * Always check your viewing glasses before you use them. If they are scratched, torn or damaged throw them away.
- * Stand still and put on your viewing glasses before looking up at the bright sun. After looking turn away and take off your viewing glasses. Don't take off your viewing glasses while looking at the sun.
- * Do not use sunglasses to look at the eclipse. They are not safe to look at the sun.
- * If you normally wear glasses, keep them on. Put your viewing glasses over them.



4-H Camp Scholarship Contest

4-H Summer Camp will be here before we know it! This year's camp will be July 9-11, 2024 at Camp Camellia in Petal, Mississippi. The Pearl River County 4-H Advisory Council is sponsoring a 4-H Summer Camp Scholarship Contest! The contest is open to all Pearl River County youth between the ages of 8-13 years. Each scholarship will cover \$100 of the registration fee. The child/parent will be responsible for the remaining balance. The contest rules are:

- 1. The essay topic is "Why I want to attend 4-H Summer Camp".
- 2. Each essay should be one page.
- 3. The essay must be handwritten in the child's own writing.
- 4. The deadline to turn in essays is **Friday**, **May 10**, **2024**. Essays should be turned in to the Pearl River County Extension Office.



- * You must have your original registration papers and grade papers with you at the show. Copies will not be accepted. Horses must be in the 4-H'ers name or an immediate family member's name. Farm names are not acceptable.
- * All ponies and miniatures will be measured.
- * If you have questions about tack, make sure ahead of time it is eligible by calling or coming by the Pearl River County Extension Service Office.
- * Be sure to read the rulebook carefully to make sure you are following all of the rules.

Horse Ethics

If this will be your first year to participate in the District and State Horse Shows or you are a new 4-H volunteer that will assist 4-H'ers with their horses, you will need to be certified in Horse Ethics. This will take about 45 minutes to an hour. Call the Pearl River County Extension office and schedule a time to complete Horse Ethics Training. THIS NEEDS TO BE DONE BEFORE APRIL 23, 2024!

4-H Poultry Chain

You can increase your knowledge of poultry management practices and life skills in the 4-H Poultry Chain. You have the opportunity to raise birds to sexual maturity while keeping a record of their progress. At the end of the project you will choose your top 3 birds to compete at the Mississippi State Fair in the poultry show. If you are a Cloverbud (ages 5-7 as of January 1, 2024) you will be able to compete on a county level. 4-H'ers ages 8-18 will be able to compete on the county and state level. You can only show one breed (females only) and must order at least 6 chicks (It is recommended that you order 20). There are 2 categories for chicks: Meat Category and Layer Category (call the office for a list of breeds). You must order your chicks from a NPIP-certified hatchery or a commercial operation that is supplied by an NPIP hatchery. Do NOT order from a NPIP-backyard flock. Now is the time to order your chicks to be delivered the week of May 19-25, 2024. You will need to register between April 1 and June 15 by calling the county office. There is an award for the Cutest Coop, for showmanship and for the show. Call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 for more information.

Camp Explore

4-H Summer Camp Explore will be held June 10-13, 2024 at Holmes Community College in Goodman, Mississippi. It is open to Junior 4-H'ers, ages 8-13. The cost of camp is \$225, which includes lodging, meals, activities, a t-shirt and 4-H activity insurance. Registration is due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, May 17, 2024**. Activities will include Outdoors, Expressive Arts, STEM, SAFETY and Teambuilding.
