In each of the stores, exhibits which are made by 4-H members from all counties, are displayed for the general public to view. Our youth made birdhouses, dream catchers, spent cartridge collections, paper weavings, drawings/paintings, dog breed information boards, sewed skirts, brought in crops and canned items and more to the 4-H Village. Shooting Sports Sign-Up

That time of the year is almost here, Shooting Sports season! But before we can get full swing into the season, we must have sign-up! Rankin County 4-H Shooting Sports sign-up will be held at the *Rankin County Extension Office*, from 5:30 – 7:30 pm.

Monday, December 5th: Returning Shooters, meaning you participated last year.

Tuesday, December 6th: New Shooters.

We will need you all to abide by these times, as it is much easier for us to manage. Sign-up will close on Tuesday, Dec. 6^{th} .

As you most of you all are aware, last season we had a record number of youth signing up for our shooting sports program. In order to try to streamline our program we have a couple of new rules and dates that all youth will have to abide by.

- Sign-up Is required for all youth, new and returning to attend, during the time frame only, no exceptions.
- All new shooters will be limited to one discipline for their first year.
- Safety Meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 2nd, 6 pm at the Extension Office. This is required for all new shooters. If you are a new shooter and unable to attend you will not be able to participate in the upcoming season. Also, the safety meeting will NOT count towards practice hours for any youth.
- Age Requirements. Most of you are aware 4-H goes by 4-H age
 (age of youth as of January 1st). Due to our earlier sign-up, if youth
 will be 8 years old as of January 1st, 2017, they will be able to attend
 sign-up, as the season will not officially start until 2017. Also, please
 remember that there are age requirements for the various
 disciplines.

<u>Discipline</u>	Min. Age. Req.	4-H Req. Age
Air Pistol	8 years old	born before 1/1/2009
.22 Pistol	14 years old	born before 1/1/2003
Air Rifle	8 years old	born before 1/1/2009
.22 Rifle	10 years old	born before 1/1/2007
Shotgun	10 years old	born before 1/1/2007
Archery	8 years old	born before 1/1/2009

- There is an enrollment deadline set for December 1st. All youth that wish to participate in Shooting Sports will have to be enrolled in Rankin County 4-H by December 1st, 2016. Youth are still able to enroll in 4-H any time after the deadline and sign-up for our program but they will be put on the wait list and will be added to teams as openings arise. There is no annual enrollment for 4-H, once you are in the system and receiving mailings you do NOT have to re-enroll your youth in 4-H. Youth are only taken out of the system if they age-out (18 years 4-H age).
- Activity Fee, as most of you know our expenses are very large in the Shooting Sports Program. With this being said we are having to charge an activity fee to help cover costs of equipment, targets, etc. The activity fee will include \$1 insurance and a t-shirt. \$25 for one discipline (t-shirt sizes youth adult XL). \$27 for one discipline (t-shirt size adult 2XL-4XL). \$15 each for second and third disciplines.
